- Eat
- Sleep
- Learn



- Cavities in baby teeth are a serious problem. Cavities in baby teeth can lead to pain, infection, bleeding, bad breath and hospitalization.
- Many children experience cavities at ages 1, 2 or 3 that are severe.
- Severe cavities can prevent children from growing and developing normally. Pain reduces children's abilities to eat, sleep and learn.
- Often, cavities in young children are so severe they are put to sleep in the hospital to have their teeth treated.
